you to hide



## Something to MAKE



Shadow Drawing is best done outside on a nice sunny day.

So, grab your hat and put on some sunscreen.

#### You will need:

- \* Some paper
  - \* A pencil
- \* Something to cast a shadow maybe a small teddy, a toy, a rock, a shoe
- 1) Put the paper on a flat sunny spot
- 2) Place your teddy on the edge of the paper so you can see it's shadow
- 3) Using your pencil, trace around the shadow (depending on how bright the sun is, will depend how dark your shadow is)
- 4) Move your teddy away and To-Da you've made a drawing of the teddy's shadow.
- 5) Now you can leave it like that or you can use your imagination and some coloured pencils, crayons, paints (which ever mum or dad says it's ok to use) to turn it into a colourful picture.






